24	Police required to enforce DVROs: § 6381 If police do not respond to a DV call, the victim (or their family in the case of homicide) could possibly sue the police. But such cases are rarely successful given governmental immunity. (Gov. Code, §§ 814-895.8.) Plus, there is case law establishing that there is no constitutionally protected property interest in enforcement of a DVRO, notwithstanding any state law to the contrary. (<i>Town of Castle Rock, Colo. v. Gonzales</i> (2005) 545 U.S. 748.)
